How to open a case

Any parent, guardian or caretaker of a child for whom child support is needed is eligible for child support services. There is no income or other eligibility requirement for services.

Individuals currently receiving CalWORKS are automatically referred to their local child support office for services.

If you are not a CalWORKS beneficiary, California charges an annual service fee of \$35.

You can apply online at **www.childsupport.ca.gov** or download and complete the child support services application packet and return it to the closest office. See our website for locations.

Who are we?

California Child Support Services assists in establishing and enforcing financial and medical support orders for children. Services are offered to either parent or any legal guardian or caretaker of children under 18. We provide neutral assistance to help all parties navigate the child support and court processes.

What is a child support case?

A child support case may be opened by either parent and creates a child support order, tracks payments, locates financial assets, and enforces child support obligations. Under federal and state law, parents have a legal duty to provide financial and medical support for their children.

We can help with:

- Establishing new orders for financial support of children
- Establishing medical support orders
- Locating parents
- Establishing legal parentage
- Enforcing new and existing child support orders
- Reducing past due child support debt
- Modifying child support orders
- Processing and tracking payments
- Keeping case records
- Granting access to the online self-service account portal

Child support offices do not:

- Handle custody or visitation matters
- Handle divorces
- Obtain or enforce restraining orders
- Establish spousal support orders
